Aging Gracefully: Living Your Best Life and Life Lessons

Actress Linda Evans has personified beauty and grace to American television viewers for over five decades, from her role as Audra Barkley, a daughter of the Old West on *The Big Valley* (1965-1969 on ABC), to glamorous Krystle Carrington on *Dynasty* (1981-1989 on ABC), to *Hell's Kitchen*, the British competitive cooking reality show she won in 2009.

For her role as Krystle, wife of oil multimillionaire played by John Forsythe and counterpart to Joan Collins' evil Alexis, Linda was nominated five times for the Golden Globe Award for Best Actress in a TV Drama series (1982-1986). She won in 1982, sharing the honor with Barbara Bel Geddes of rival prime time television soap opera Dallas.

Linda won five People's Choice Awards and was nominated for an Emmy Award for Outstanding Lead Actress in a Drama Series in 1983. Linda earned a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame.

The Good Neighbor: The Life & Work of Fred Rogers

Maxwell King's four-decade career includes the presidencies of two of the country's largest philanthropies and the editorship of one of its most influential daily newspapers.

King joined The Pittsburgh Foundation, with assets of more than \$1\$ billion, in 2014 as president and CEO.

Before that, King served for two years as director of the Fred Rogers Center for Early Learning and Children's Media at Saint Vincent College in Latrobe, Westmoreland County.

As president of the Pittsburgh-based Heinz Endowments from 1999 until 2008, he led the disbursement of about \$500 million in grants to projects, organizations and initiatives primarily in western Pennsylvania.

From 1990 to 1998, King was editor of the *Philadelphia Inquirer*, recognized by *Time* magazine as one of the five best newspapers in America at that time.



THE CAPITOL STEPS

Over 30 years ago, the Capitol Steps began as a group of Senate staffers who set out to satirize the people and places that employed them. Not all of the current members of the Steps are former Capitol Hill staffers, however, collectively they have worked in 18 Congressional offices representing 62 years of House and Senate staff experience.

The Capitol Steps have recorded 33 albums, including their latest, Fiscal Shades of Gray and their special holiday release, Barackin' Around the Christmas Tree. They have been featured on NBC, CBS, ABC, and PBS, and can be heard four times a year on NPR stations nationwide during their Politics Takes a Holiday radio specials.

The Capitol Steps were born in 1981 when staffers for Senator Charles Percy were planning entertainment for a Christmas party. Ronald Reagan was President so cofounders Elaina Newport, Bill Strauss and Jim Aidala figured that if entertainers could become politicians, then politicians could become entertainers!

Hamilton vs. Jefferson: The Rivalry That Shaped America

Louis Masur is Distinguished Professor of American Studies and History at Rutgers University. A graduate of the University at Buffalo and Princeton University, he is a cultural historian.

His most recent work is Lincoln's Last Speech: Wartime Reconstruction & The Crisis of Reunion (2015), Lincoln's Hundred Days: The Emancipation Proclamation and the War for the Union (2012), and The Civil War: A Concise History (2011).

Masur's essays and reviews have appeared in the New York Times, Boston Globe, Chicago Tribune, and Los Angeles Times. He has also written for the American Scholar, Chronicle of Higher Education, Salon, and Slate.

Masur has been elected to membership of the American Antiquarian Society, the Massachusetts Historical Society, and the Society of American Historians and has received teaching prizes from Harvard University, the City College of New York, and Trinity College.
